Ute Hedrich is Church Councillor and Desk Officer for Middle and Far East, Australia, and the Pacific at the Evangelische Kirche Germany (EKD). One of her duties is maintaining contact with church organisations in Asia. She taught gender, theology and Christian ethics at the United Theological college.



CHEN Qurui

Ms. CHEN Qirui is a Lecturer at the East China Theological Seminary in Shanghai and a theological doctoral candidate of the University Helsinki. She holds a Master of Theology from Nanjing University and Master of Sacred Theology from Boston University.
