## Speakers



### Ute Hedrich

Ute Hedrich is Church Councillor and Desk Officer for Middle and Far East, Australia, and the Pacific at the Evangelische Kirche Germany (EKD). One of her duties is maintaining contact with church organisations in Asia. She taught gender, theology and Christian ethics at the United Theological college.



### CHEN Qurui

Ms. CHEN Qirui is a Lecturer at the East China Theological Seminary in Shanghai and a theological doctoral candidate of the University Helsinki. She holds a Master of Theology from Nanjing University and Master of Sacred Theology from Boston University. She has published numerous articles on systematic theology and feminist theology both in Chinese and English.



### XIONG Jing

Ms. XIONG Jing received her Master's degree in Gender Studies from the Chinese University of Hong Kong. She has been a prominent feminist activist in China for the past decade, and was the editor and executive director of Feminist Voices. She is an expert in social media advocacy, community organizing and mobilization. She currently works at the Equality Rights Project at the Faculty of Law, University of Hong Kong

Ms. Schmitz is a catholic theologian working with other likeminded women at Maria 2.0 in Hamburg. Maria 2.0 is a grassroots movement of women, who are networking with all people fighting for reforms in the Catholic Church.
